

Say Something

Information Processing: Exploring and Discovering

PROCESS

- Choose a partner.
- Read silently and simultaneously to designated stopping points.
- When each partner is ready, stop and “say something.”
 - The something might be a question, a brief summary, a key point, an interesting idea, or a personal connection.
- Continue the process until you have completed the selection.

ALTERNATIVES

- When feasible, assign this as work to be done before a meeting.

TIPS

- Use with short reading selections—four or five paragraphs is about as long as is useful.
